Community Action Agency Services

Do you know what Community Action Agency does?

Community Action Agency is Head Start and Human Resources Authority, Inc together. Community Action Agency employees approximately 230 people. Listed below are the departments and services offered to people in Delta, Menominee, Schoolcraft counties.

Adult Day Services — 2635 1st Ave S, Escanaba, 906-789-2886 is geared to meet the needs of those with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

Client Services — Client Service Centers are available in Menominee, Delta and Schoolcraft Counties to assist people who are struggling financially due to unexpected circumstances like shut offs for heat or water. Information and referral to other services and budgeting.

CSFP / TEFAP — Throughout the year Senior Services provides two food distribution programs — the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) and The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). Eligibility for both programs is based on household income. Call your local Senior Center.

Early Childhood Program — The Early Childhood Program is dedicated to providing comprehensive services that support the healthy development of young children and their families. The program primarily serves low income families with children from birth to age 5 and pregnant women within Menominee, Delta and Schoolcraft Counties through Head Start, Early Head Start and Michigan Department of Education funding.

Foster Grandparent Program — Help guide students to higher academic achievement. Mentor children who need a little help. The Foster Grandparent program connects role models like you with young people with exceptional needs.

Homeless Assistance — The housing staff work with any individuals or families who are literally homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness at the time of entry and help people stabilize their housing needs by providing them with resources and access to housing programs.

In-Home Services — In-Home Services includes homemaker aide services (light housekeeping), respite care (provides companionship and supervision in relief of the primary caregiver), and home care assistance (assistance with activities of daily living).

Nutrition Services — The Congregate Meals Program is designed for the 60+ population. It provides an opportunity for people to come together for lunch in a group setting at one of our senior centers or carry out at this time. The Home Delivered Meal Program assists homebound seniors with their dietary needs. Hot meals are available Monday through Friday with frozen dinners available for the weekend.

Retired & Senior Volunteer Program — The largest volunteer network in the nation for people 55 and over. You can use the skills and talents you've learned over the years, or develop new ones while serving in a variety of volunteer activities within your community.

Senior Centers — The centers serve as community focal points, providing a wide range of activities and services for 60+ population, including congregate meals, games, dancing, exercise and informational presentations.

Senior Companion Program — Senior Companion volunteers add richness to the lives of their clients, while providing access to the community, including grocery shopping, transportation to medical appointments and opportunities for socialization.

Weatherization/Energy Services — The Weatherization Program provides free energy conservation services for eligible low-income households. The local agency determines applicant eligibility, performs the necessary inspections and contracts with qualified, licensed and insured private contractors to complete the work.

Welcome Newborns — Welcome Newborns mission is to promote the well being of children, improve parent-child relations and prevent child abuse and neglect.

Medicare Minutes

MMAP counselors can assist you with a variety of Medicare or Medicaid issues. Some examples are:

*Explain insurance coverage in simple terms.

*Assist with appeals when there are issues with billing or claims.

*Help apply for assistance for Medicaid or low-income subsidy programs.

*Help finding patient assistance programs.

MMAP Counselors are located at most of our Senior Centers in the U.P. and lower Michigan.

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE OPEN ENROLLMENT PERIOD: JANUARY 1-MARCH 31, 2025

The Medicare fall open enrollment period ended on December 7, 2024. For those who made changes, their new coverage began on January 1, 2025. For those who were enrolled in a Medicare Advantage Plan prior to December 31, 2024, and didn't do any changing or comparing before December 7, this is another window to review/ change.

In this timeframe, you are eligible to look at and compare Medicare Advantage plans, and find a different one of the same level (meaning including a drug plan etc.) to change. You could also drop your Medicare Advantage plan, and return to original Medicare and pick up a stand-alone drug plan. Each decision should be reviewed carefully so that you understand your coverage.

For example: If you are looking to return to original Medicare, pick up a stand-alone drug plan, and pick up a Medigap supplemental insurance plan, know that outside of your initial enrollment window, or new to Medicare Advantage window, the Medigap insurance companies will ask health questions, and depending on your health status could deny you coverage. It may also take a little time for an agent to get back to you, so don't wait until the last minute.

So, before you change totally, do your research, or make an appointment with a MMAP counselor to help you understand changes you may want to make to your Medicare coverage.

Upcoming Foot Clinics: January 3 and February 10

Visit includes: trimming of toenails, thinning of thickening toenails and debridement (if necessary), and finishes off with a mini foot massage.






